He made his Carnegie Hall conducting debut in New York last year and has performed in venues such as the Royal Albert Hall, Vienna's Musikverein and La Scala Milan.

1. Candidates play **one piece** or movement of their own choice **not exceeding five minutes** duration.
2. Please note 'under 10' means 'aged 10 and under'. (The same applies in all categories)
3. Candidates must qualify in age on 10th May 2025.
4. An original copy of the music must be provided for the adjudicator on the day of competition.
5. Candidates must register in the office thirty minutes before their competition is due to begin.
6. The closing date for receipt of music entries is **Thursday 10th April.**
7. The decision of the adjudicator is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
8. Previous first prize winners may not compete in the same category again.
9. Accompanist can only be provided if a **clear hard copy** of the music comes in **with the entry.** Digital transfer not accepted.
10. ***Beginners** are classed as those who have only been learning their instrument for a short time, a year or two. Any instrument or voice in the group is accepted
